Lions of Illinois Foundation (LIF) Camp Helen Keller

Come enjoy summer fun and friends at LIF Camp Helen Keller in Ingleside, Illinois, located about three hours north of Peoria. Camp dates are from June 17th to June 23rd. This camp is in tune with blind or visually impaired adults. The camp offers water activities on a semi-private lake, a pool, nature walks, team sports, paddleboats, crafts, archery, fire-side cookouts with s'mores, horseback riding, rock wall climb, and a zip line. To be eligible for camp, applicants must meet all of the following requirements: Be at least 18-years-old or older; Either blind or have low vision (with best correction of 20/70) and/or be deaf or hard of hearing; Campers must be completely independent in all personal/hygiene care. One-to-one care is not provided by LIF Camp Helen Keller Staff; Independently ambulatory around the campsite and activity areas; Cognitively capable of understanding, following, and retaining instruction and information from staff. Camp expenses will be at no cost to Center patrons and rides to and from the camp will be available. Please call the office to reserve your space. Applications must be submitted by June 1, 2018.
