#### **ASSISTIVE DEVICE LOANER PROGRAM**

Did you know the CICBVI offers various assistive devices for low and no vision individuals through their loaner program? We have various items, including desk top magnifiers available to loan for however long they are needed. For the more expensive items (some of these items cost thousands of dollars) we do require a small, refundable, deposit.

We also have other items such as personal braille machines, audio devices and more. In addition, we have a program to provide free Alexa devices to qualifying patrons. All you have to do is call the center and ask. We have already provided devices and Alexa's to several patrons and the feedback has been very positive. These devices can make a huge difference in patrons' ability to be independent and and safe in their homes. This program is made possible through the grant we received from the Peoria North Rotary.

But wait. There's more! We have a fairly extensive library of books and music on CD that patrons can borrow. Not only that, we can mail them directly to your home! Questions? Interested? Just call the Center – 309-637-3693.
