WE COULDN'T DO WHAT WE DO WITHOUT YOU!

Most of you know that two years ago, the CICBVI was the fortunate recipient of a grant from Impact Central Illinois that was designated to kick start our renovation efforts in our kitchen and the Uftring Technology Center. Impact Central Illinois is a women's collective giving organization seeking to make a positive impact in their communities and they have made a HUGE impact on the Center. Their gift created a snowball effect, with donations coming in from Rotary Peoria-North, the Indo-American Society of Peoria, Verizon, the employees of the Uftring Auto Group, the Pilot Club of Peoria and several private individuals.

Thanks to these grants and gifts, we were able to update counters and equipment in the kitchen, install new flooring in the tech room, paint AND purchase new equipment specifically designed for the blind and visually impaired with professional trainers available to provide education on their use. We were also able to update our loaner program so more individuals can benefit from the latest assistive technology.

This is a project with no end in sight – we envision a future where we will be able to share technology in all its forms – from specially designed labeling and identification systems to apps for a smart phone or computer, to GPS enabled canes to readers and magnifiers and more.

Two years after that first grant, we held an Open House June 25th to show off what was accomplished and what the Central IL Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired is all about – helping people with visual impairments live life to the fullest. We could not do this without you – thank you from the bottom of our hearts – from the patrons, staff and board of the CICBVI.
